

CUP ROYALE offense/Defense Game:



How to apply offensive (creating space) and defensive (denying space) strategies in a game situation.

Moving to get open and moving to block players is a key part of offense and defense.

I can get open to receive passes. I can move to block passes.

Inquiry Question: How do defensive strategies help limit scoring opportunities?

How to play:

Level 1: 1 Team (cup color) is the offensive/attacking team. They are trying to knock the cup off of everyone else's stick. Students that get their cup knocked off perform an exercise and then continue to play. Play until all teams have had turn to play offense.

Level 2: All teams against each other at the same time. Students are playing both offense and defense to protect their cone while knocking their opponents' cones off. Students that get their cone knocked off perform an exercise and continue to play.

Level 3: 2 Teams join forces to play against each other. Each team gets a turn to play offense (knock cones off) and defense (protect cone). If a player gets their cone knocked off the offensive opponent gets to keep their cone. The player that does not have a cone moves into position to protect their other teammates cones. Teams switch roles when the last cone is knocked off.
